# Lax action in response to violence against Dalits in Nelamangala village: Report

Dalits are allegedly denied entry into all temples in Kachakanahalli

A fact-finding study of a recent attack on a Dalit community by an ‘upper’ caste in Kachakanahalli, Nelamangala, on the outskirts of Bengaluru, has not only found lax punitive action by district administration, but also a wide prevalence of discriminatory practices in the village.

The report says that Dalits are not allowed into any of the five temples in the village and bonded labour is still practised in the village. The report has recommended launching a temple entry campaign in the village. The fact finding was organised by All India People’s Forum.

The report alleges that a group of around 50-60 ‘upper’ caste men (Vokkaligas) barged into the Dalit (Madiga) lane in the village and attacked people, injuring many, on the night of September 8. This was preceded by a man from the Vokkaliga community threatening a Dalit youth who was trying to organise the community to defy the dictate of the ‘upper’ castes in the village.

attacks on Dalits,” the report stated. In the last decade alone, there have been three other such attacks by ‘upper’ castes against Dalits in the village. “However, all cases were compromised,” the report observed, arguing there was a pattern to caste violence in the village that had gone unchecked.

**Police delay**

The report says there was a

five-hour delay in police arriving at the village, before which the village panchayat members tried to broker a compromise between the two groups, which the Dalits rejected.

Nelamangala Assembly constituency is reserved for Scheduled Castes and its MLA K. Srinivas Murthy from JD(S), however, intervened in “an attempt to persuade the victims and their com-

munity to settle for a compromise and drop the case against the aggressors,” the report further stated.

It went on to recommend action against him for obstructing justice.

However, the MLA, speaking to *The Hindu*, denied the allegation and said he has always sided with the victims and would stand by them in the future too.

## Section 307

The report also alleges lax action by Bengaluru Rural district police and stated they did not register a case under Section 307 of the Indian Penal Code for attempt to murder and that the FIR only mentions II of over 50 people who were part of the attack.

Ravi D. Channannavar, SP, Bengaluru Rural, said Section 307 had already been added to the FIR, and though the FIR may have not named all the 50, they will be identified and arrested “in due course of the probe,” he said.

# City’s LED street lights project further delayed

Survey for baseline assessment yet to be taken up

The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike’s ambitious LED street light project continues to be hindered by delays. The work on what was touted as the “biggest street light project in the country” is yet to begin.

The delay is being attributed to the Model Code of Conduct that was in place ahead of the parliamentary elections in May this year.

Senior officials in the civic body told *The Hindu* that work order to replace the nearly 4.85 lakh sodium vapour lights with LED had been issued to an agency in February. The switch would help the civic body achieve energy savings, that will translate into reduction in spending on electricity charges.

However, before the sodium vapour lights can be replaced, a baseline assessment of the existing lights is essential. “A chartered engi-

neering firm must be chosen to take up this baseline assessment. We had floated tenders for the same. Four vendors participated, of whom two were shortlisted. It has been sent to the State government for approval,” sources said.

**Government approval**

The tenders for the baseline assessment amount to around ₹6 crore and work can be taken up only after government approval. “The files pertaining to the shor-

tlisted vendors were sent to the State government around a month ago. As soon as the government accords approval, we will issue the work order to the select vendor to take up the survey immediately,” sources said.

“The timeline for the project is three years. By 2021, all the 4.85 lakh street lights will be replaced with LED,” said the source, and added that the International Financial Corporation, a sister concern of the World Bank, was the transactional advisor for the project, which was estimated at ₹560 crore.

**₹12 crore a month**

The civic body spends ₹12 crore every month as electricity charges on street lights. Once the sodium vapour lights are replaced, the power bills may come down by at least ₹4 crore. “It is a win-win for the BBMP, as we will not be spending on capital investment and we will be paying less towards electricity charges. The agency will recover the capital investment from the energy savings and pay the rest to the BBMP,” an official said.

*The Zoya Factor* is not quite what you’d assume it to be – a woman-centred romantic comedy. It’s the hero who runs away with the chick flick. Based on Anuja Chauhan’s novel of the same title, the film has a bumbling ad executive, Zoya Solanki (Sonam Kapoor) at its centre. On a shoot with the Indian cricket team, she ends up becoming its lucky mascot for the world cup and also charms her way to the team captain Nikhil Khodas (Dulquer Salmaan) heart. It’s the ultimate romantic fantasy of any Indian girl next door.

On paper the personal and professional struggles of Zoya seem like an ideal vehicle for any wannabe Indian Bridget Jones to run riot. Not quite. The ditzy manner of the impeccably clad Sonam Kapoor works only up to a point and becomes pesky when stretched over two hours. Like her, the quirky tenor of the film also feels deliberate than organic and is irritating and clunky at that. The misunderstandings between the lovers are played out the worst. Not only do they feel needless but also inert. Where’s the emotional pull? And, one hasn’t yet addressed how the combination of the world of cricket and advertising easily paves the way for some uncomfortably conspicuous in-film brand endorsement.

While that other ex-military drifter, Jack Reacher is part Rimbaud and part Rambo, with a fascination for prime number factorization and head butting, John Rambo gives mathematics and the Romantics a wide berth while handing out a particular brand of justice using his special skill set.

The fifth movie in the franchise which started with *First Blood* (1982), is violent and gory (I was watching from between my fingers) and easily forgettable – if not for the bone crunching violence, which one would like to wipe out of memory as soon as possible.

Trying for an elegiac tone complete with wooden house and beautiful horses is laughable as the movie quickly devolves into horrific violence with beating hearts and collar being pried out. The story involves Rambo living the quiet life on a ranch in Arizona with

the beautiful Gabrielle and her grandmother. When Gabrielle runs off to Mexico to find her estranged father and finds herself in the hands of vicious drug dealers and human traffickers, it is left to Rambo to shoot ‘em up and bring her home.

Co-written by Stallone, *Last Blood* abounds in stereotypes. The bad guys are flat and indistinguishable and would have been awful cartoons were not for all the blood, broken bones and decapitations. Apart from Stallone as Rambo, everyone else is interchangeable including Paz Vega as Carmen Delgado, a journalist with a propensity to leave her shirt unbuttoned. The Mexican bad guys have a questionable taste in music as they shoot the speakers rather than listen to Jim Morrison silkily sing ‘Five to One’ – not even ‘Roadhouse Blues’!

# Gas leak: Man sustains burns

A man sustained severe burns in a fire triggered by leaking LPG in his house at Kodagalahatti, near Chikkajala, on Friday. The police identified the injured as Ramesh, 28, a clerk in a private travel firm in the city.

The incident occurred when he went to the kitchen to make coffee. As the gas cylinder was not damaged, the police initially suspected there was another source for the fire. However, Fire Services officials later ascertained that there was a gas leak. When Ramesh lit the stove, two perfume bottles kept near the stove exploded, causing him severe burns. He is being treated at Victoria Hospital and is said to be out of danger.
